# National Park Service Internship Program & Samp; Approximation 2025

## Description

The National Park Service (NPS) Internship Program & Opportunities 2025 is designed to provide students and emerging professionals with practical experience in natural resource management, cultural preservation, education, and public engagement within the National Park Service. Interns will have the unique opportunity to work in national parks across the United States, gaining valuable skills, knowledge, and exposure to the operations of one of the nation's most respected federal agencies. This program serves as an entry point for those interested in conservation, historical preservation, and park management careers.

### Responsibilities

- Assist with Natural and Cultural Resource Management: Support park staff in maintaining and protecting natural resources, wildlife habitats, and cultural sites within the park system. Tasks may include monitoring ecosystems, collecting data, and helping with conservation initiatives.

- Academic Standing: Applicants should maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 or

- 2. **Provide References:** Submit two to three references, including academic or professional references who can speak to your qualifications and interest in the field.
- Select Preferred Locations and Roles: Indicate your preferred parks or regions where you would like to intern, as well as specific roles or areas of interest
- 4. **Interview Process:** Candidates selected for an interview will be contacted to discuss their qualifications, skills, and interests further. Interviews may be conducted in person, by phone, or via video conference.
- 5. **Internship Placement:** Interns will be notified of their acceptance and placement. Upon selection, you will receive detailed instructions regarding orientation, housing, and program start dates.
